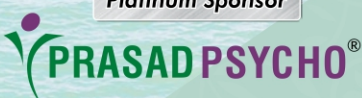

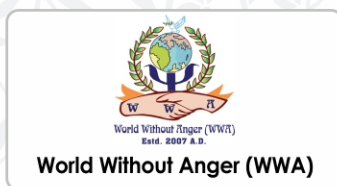

Abstract Submission Guidelines

1. Abstracts should be **original, unpublished academic work** and written in **English** only.
2. Only **Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx)** files will be accepted. **PDF format will not be accepted.**
3. The abstract must be **submitted by email** on or before **15th August, 2026** to: **abstract@iahp.health**
4. The abstract **must not exceed 250 words** and should be typed on **A4 paper** with **double spacing**.
5. Include the following items at the top of the abstract file, formatted in **Times New Roman, 14 pt**:
 - Title of the paper
 - Author(s) name(s)
 - Institutional affiliation(s)
 - Email ID of the corresponding author
6. The main text of the abstract should be in **Times New Roman, 12 pt**, in a **structured format** covering the following elements (where applicable):
 - **Background**
 - **Objectives**
 - **Methods**
 - **Results**
 - **Conclusions**
 - **Keywords:** At least **three keywords**.
7. The abstract should be a clear and concise summary of the research, allowing reviewers to assess relevance, quality, and linkage to the conference themes.
8. Each abstract will be **peer-reviewed by the Scientific Committee**, and authors will be notified of acceptance via email.
9. At least one author of each accepted abstract is required to **register for the conference** to confirm inclusion in the program.
10. Accepted abstracts will be scheduled for **Oral (PPT) presentation** during the conference.
11. **Presentation certificates** will be issued **only to registered authors and co-authors**.
12. From the pool of presentations, **30 papers** will be selected by the Scientific Committee for **further review and editorial refinement** and published in an **edited book with an ISBN**, in partnership with a reputable national/international publisher. Additional terms and conditions for publication will be provided by the Organizing Committee.

IAHP Awards

1. Manju Thakur Memorial Oration Award

This award is instituted by Dr. Archana Thakur, Joint Secretary, U.G.C. in memory of her mother. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar for delivering a special lecture on any contemporary issue of health and well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

2. Anita Memorial Oration Award:

This award is instituted by Prof. Anand Kumar, President; IAHP in the memory of his beloved wife. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar for delivering a special lecture who has carried out an outstanding work in the area of health and well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

3. Dr. Lalit Kumar Vaya Behavioural Health Scientist Award:

This award is instituted by Prof. S. L. Vaya, Life Time Professor, Rashtriya Raksha University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat in the name of her husband. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar who has carried out an innovative work in the applied aspect of health and well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

4. Dr. Janmejy Pradhan Innovative Health Scientist Award:

This award is instituted by Dr. Anjali Pradhan, Consultant- Development Sector, New Delhi, in the memory of her husband. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar who has carried out an innovative work in the assessment/digital assessment in health and well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

Awards for all Applicants Participating in the 11th ICIAHP-2025

1. G.P. Thakur Young Scientist Award:

A special session for the young scientist award will be organised for young researchers and scholars (age up to 35 years as on 15th August, 2026). The author should be a Life member of IAHP. Paper should be single authored only and a self-declaration to the effect that the paper has neither been presented in any forum nor been published in any form is a mandatory requirement. The papers received for this session will be reviewed by a screening committee and based on the quality and significance of the research, only 05 papers will be selected for presentation in the IAHP Young scientist award session and remaining papers will be considered for presentation in the relevant scientific sessions. The results will be declared and the citation of IAHP Young scientist award will be presented to the awardee at the valedictory session of the conference.

2. IAHP Best Paper Award:

Best paper award will be organised for researchers and scholars (age up to 45 years as on 15th August, 2026). The author should be a Life member of IAHP. Paper should be single authored only and a self-declaration to the effect that the paper has neither been presented in any forum nor been published in any form is a mandatory requirement. The papers received for this session will be reviewed by a screening committee and based on the quality and significance of the research, only 05 papers will be selected for presentation in the Best paper award session and remaining papers will be considered for presentation in the relevant scientific sessions. The results will be declared and the citation of IAHP Best paper award will be presented to the awardee at the valedictory session of the conference.

Note: Interested participants applying for the Young Scientist Award or Best Paper Award category are required to submit their abstract and full paper along with their IAHP Life Membership Number, age proof, and self-declaration by **15th August 2026**. The submission should be addressed to **Prof. Anand Kumar, President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology**, and sent via email to **president@iahp.health**

Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC)

All international participants travelling to Thailand must complete the **Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC)** within 3 days before arrival. The TDAC is mandatory for entry into Thailand. Participants are advised to keep their passport, flight details, confirmed accommodation booking, and return/onward ticket ready before submission. After successful submission, a QR Code will be generated which must be presented during immigration.

Note: The TDAC application is completely FREE of cost. Participants are strongly advised to apply only through the official Thailand Immigration website and avoid third-party/fake websites charging unnecessary fees.

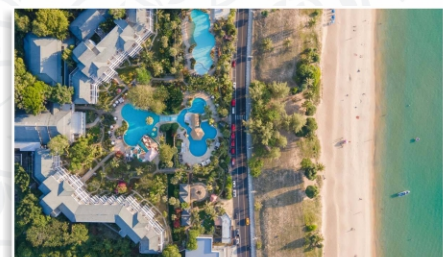
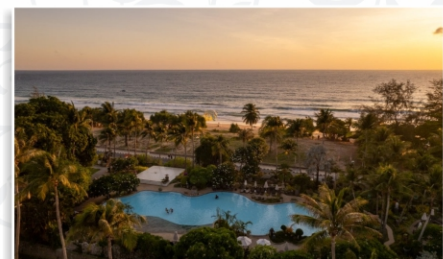
How to Reach

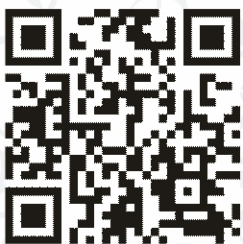
